YEAR FIVE TRIP TO GUILDFORD CATHEDRAL

On Friday 6th March year five children accompanied by Mr Whalley, Mrs Lightstone and Mr Grafton attended a workshop held in the cathedral on the theme of Holy Week.

The morning began with the children having a short act of worship during which there was a short narration of the story of Jesus from Palm Sunday to the resurrection. After which the children were split up into seven groups in which they did activities connected to the theme. These included the making of palm crosses, colouring in a stained glass window and a Celtic cross, brass rubbing, producing a short drama, and hunting for all the crosses in the cathedral and design a newspaper front highlighting the main events.

The children enjoyed their various activities and were very impressed with the cathedral itself. Their behaviour was very respectful in such a location. All of the children have brought back something that they produced during the morning. Some of their work has gone home, and others are on display in the cloister by our chapel. It was a very enjoyable morning and the children got a lot out of the experience.

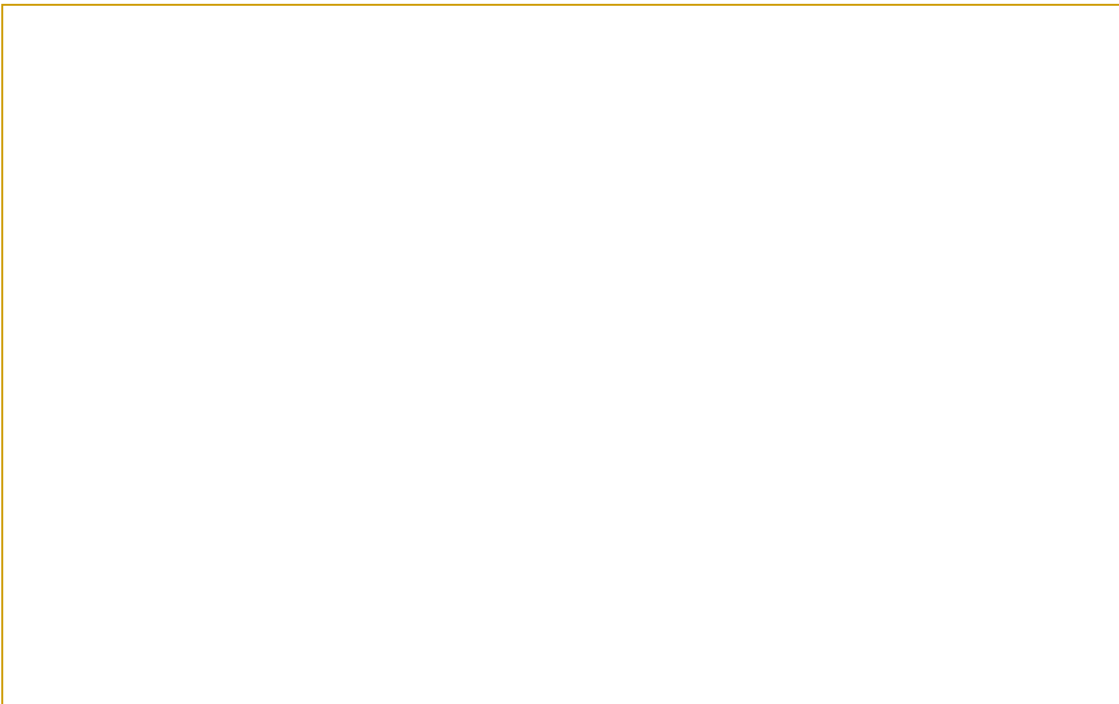
