A REMINDER ABOUT WEDNESDAY AFTERNOONS THIS TERM

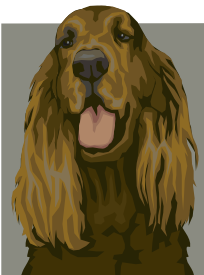
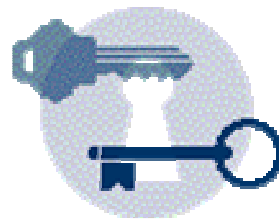
In the Summer Term, the pick-up times and preps on a Wednesday are all hit by cricket matches, which do not end until 6.00pm. We have therefore decided that there will be no formal prep set on a Wednesday evening this term. Instead the children will have some learning work and/or some independent, ongoing study work to complete. Children not in matches on a Wednesday and girls in rounders matches may leave at 4.30pm (same time as Year 3 and 4) and take any work home with them. If you have come to support a home rounders match, you may take your daughter home after match tea. Children in home cricket matches will be ready for pick-up shortly after 6.00pm and you will be advised of return times for away cricketers. Should you wish your child (in Years 5-8) to remain in school up until 6.00pm however, there will be a prep/study session in the History and Geography rooms from 5.00-6.00pm for boarders and for those day children wishing to stay. If your child is staying beyond 5.00pm, they should be collected from these rooms in the Malan Building and signed out with the member of staff. Each Tuesday morning, the children will be asked by their form teachers whether they are likely to be staying beyond 5.00pm that Wednesday.
